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Queensland Rail SARC (Safely Access the Rail Corridor) Information Sheet



TLIF2080 Safely access the rail corridor

TLIW2001 Operate under track protection rules

Course overview:

This course will provide learners with the skills and knowledge they require to be able to safely access Queensland Rail's rail corridor. The course explains how workers can maintain their safety while working in the rail corridor, the policies and procedures relating to accessing the corridor and how to identify issues, risks, hazard and equipment that workers may come across while working in this environment.

This course aligns to the following National Units of Competency:

- TLIF2080 Safely access the rail corridor
- TLIW2001 Operate under track protection rules

Training references the following Queensland Network Rules:

- QR 2000 – A Safe Place
- QR 2001 – Walking in the Danger Zone
- QR 2003 – Handsignals and Verbal Commands
- QR 2031 – Responsibilities of Track Workers
- QR 3029 – Security in the Rail Corridor
- QR 6007 – Signs - General
- QR 2009 – Reporting and Responding to a Condition Affecting the Network



Prior to attending this training applicants must:

- Provide a government issue photo identification
- Provide a valid USI. (if you don't already have a USI it can be generated at the following location: www.usi.gov.au)

Cost:

SARC (Excluding Fatigue training): Cost per person is \$250.

Training and Assessment for SARC QR3.2 (TLIF2080, TLIW2001,).

SARC (with Fatigue training): Cost per person is \$480.

Training and Assessment for SARC QR3.2 (TLIF2080, TLIW2001, TLIF2010).

Other Prices

- SARC + WET Cost per person \$450 per person
- SARC + Fatigue + WET \$630 per person



The course fee includes workbook and assessment material.

Participants must provide payment, a **completed enrolment form and USI number** before training day.

Upon successful completion of this course participants will receive a Statement of Attainment (SOA). You will also receive a QR Certificate of Achievement (CoA) for the applicable QR approved course.

NOTE: Same day RISI Training and Medical are available. (CAT3 medicals price on application).

Cost for issue of RIW card and uploading data to rail industry worker onsite system is additional to the course fee and payable to the RIW card Provider (approx. \$100 + GST).

NOTE - Following successful completion of training you must apply for and be issued with an RIW card with a Queensland Role before work in the rail corridor.

Issue of RIW Card:

In order to receive an RIW card, participants must arrange with their actual/potential employer to apply for an RIW card. This requires individuals providing 100 points of identification and a registered company submitting the individual's **Statement of Attainment** and **SARC Certificate of Achievement** together with a **CAT 3 medical certificate** issue by an approved medical provider.

Applicants will require a Category 3 medical certificate issued by a medical practitioner listed on the Rail Industry Worker website: <https://www.riw.net.au/authorised-health-professionals/>

(Note if you are planning to later enrol in other rail safety training you should check if it is more applicable to arrange for a Category 1 medical instead of the Category 3 assessment).

Learning Outcomes:

On successful completion of training, participants will have the knowledge and understanding of the following as they relate to your job role:

- Demonstrate how to safely access and work in the rail corridor
- Recognise the Danger Zone
- Identify and access a Safe Place
- Identify the direction of approaching traffic
- Understand minimum sighting distances
- Maintain situational awareness to identify potential risks
- Identify and explain the use of communication tools when working in the rail environment
- Identify safety hazards, risks and controls used in the rail corridor
- Identify and report unsafe situations within the rail environment
- Undertake work activities under local track protection rules in accordance with safeworking rules, procedures, and regulatory requirements

Program Schedule: Typically, 0730 to 1530 weekdays (days subject to demand) Weeknight and weekend sessions may be available subject to booking numbers.

For standard weekday times face-to-face learning generally covers 0730 to 1530 with breaks. You will be required to arrive 20 minutes ahead of the nominated start time to confirm all enrolment details are completed.

Requirement for attending Training:

To attend training on the day you must:

- **Have confirmed enrolment details and paid the course fee**
- **Bring a pen to take notes and complete the assessment**
- **Provide a government issued photo ID (driver's license etc).**
- **wear appropriate clothing to be able to perform in group activities and demonstrations**

If you have any special circumstance, which may need to be adhered during the study or assessment of this program please speak to one of our personnel so that we are able to assist you. Assessment

Learning and assessment activities will be conducted by assessors using a range of evidence gathering techniques throughout the course, including written and practical demonstrations. Your trainer will provide you with any support you may require with your assessment throughout the training.

If you are assessed as “Not yet competent” on the first attempt, you will be given another opportunity to demonstrate your competence. If you are still not successful after this you may need to reenroll and repeat the unit of work.

Pre-requisites

This course requires you to read, write and communicate in English. Due to the safety critical nature of communication in the rail industry, you need to be able to communicate effectively in English. If uncertain that you have the appropriate literacy levels to participate in this program you may be required to complete a simple language, literacy, and numeracy test before attending training.
